GUIDELINES FOR ESTABLISHING
UTAH RESIDENCY FOR TUITION PURPOSES

**THE LAW: ESTABLISHING UTAH DOMICILE AND MAINTAINING CONTINUOUS UTAH RESIDENCY
FOR ONE YEAR (12 CALENDAR MONTHS) AND DECLARING FINANCIAL INDEPENDENCE.**

CHECKLIST TO APPLY ON 12-MONTH LAW:

- You are a US citizen or Permanent Resident of US: (If you are a Permanent Resident, you need to provide a copy of your card.)
- Evidences of establishing domicile:** Utah driver license, Utah vehicle registration and Utah voter registration. ALL of these must have an issue date of at least 3 MONTHS BEFORE THE SEMESTER BEGINS. If you are applying for fall semester, you should have these items by the first week in June. If you are applying for spring semester, you should have these items by the first week in October. Turn copies in WITH your application for residency when you are eligible to submit it for review.
- Twelve (12) continuous months living in Utah (being physically present) as a student or non student:** (This is the most recent 12 continuous months.) Evidences would include schooling and employment. Provide a copy of your lease or rent agreement while you were in school. You will need to provide verification of rent or lease AND Utah employment for the summer months or any time in the twelve months that you were not enrolled in school. You may be absent from the state for up to 30 days during the 12-month period.
- Declaration of Financial Independence:** You must complete and sign this section on the third page of the application. You will need to document (provide copies) that you have NOT been claimed on state or federal tax returns for the most recent tax filing by any person not a Utah resident. Provide copies of your own tax filing claiming yourself or a copy of your parents' tax filing NOT claiming you as a dependent. (If you have questions regarding this item, please contact the Admissions Office.)
- Submitting your Application for Residency for Tuition Purposes:** You must be admitted to the University before this application can be processed. Submit your application to the USU Admissions Office, TSC 102. Submit your application for fall semester between July 25th and September 12th. Submit your application for spring semester between November 25th and January 15th. Include photocopies of supporting documentation. **Do not forget to sign the application.**

THERE ARE PROVISIONS in the Board of Regents policy that enable a person to be granted Utah residency for tuition purposes as an exception to the law listed above. Please contact the Admissions Office for more information regarding requirements and restrictions for each exception. A few exceptions are listed below:

- A. Dependent children and spouses of those who obtain full-time employment and move to Utah.
- B. Certain individuals recruited or transferred to Utah with full-time employment.
- C. Certain persons who have a parent who is a Utah resident.
- D. Persons who marry a Utah resident. (The spouse must be a Utah resident before the marriage.)
- E. Active-duty military personnel with current duty station in Utah can pay resident tuition while they are stationed here. Also, there are some exceptions for certain military members who are deployed while attending school.
- F. Native Americans who are registered on the tribal rolls of Tribes whose lands are contiguous to Utah. (Documentation required.)
