

COLLEGE OF SCIENCE SENATOR

The role of the ASUSU Academic Senate is to enhance the quality of academic life for the students of ASUSU. This will be accomplished through legislation initiated from both the Academic Senate as well as the Academic Representative Assembly and through direct advocacy to University Administration, College Deans and College Administration.

Charter

- I. The Science Senator's main purpose is to represent the students in the College of Science to:
 - A. The ASUSU Academic Senate and University Administration.
 1. The senator shall serve as a member of the ASUSU Academic Senate and any appropriate committee, sub-committee, or board.
 2. The senator shall have the opportunity to run for the Senator Pro Tempore and act in behalf of the Academic Senate as a member of ASUSU Executive Council.
 2. The senator shall participate in the Academic Representative Assembly, which shall be scheduled at the beginning of each semester, to give direction and outline the senator's legislative issues and goals for the semester. (These legislative priorities will include university-wide and college specific issues.)
 3. The senator shall actively participate in weekly Academic Senate meetings that will include, but not be limited to:
 - a. Discuss current ASUSU Legislation
 - b. Discuss progress of senator's legislative priorities, and
 - c. Discuss college concerns and issues.
 - B. The College of Science Dean, college administration, college faculty and College of Science alumni.
 1. The senator shall meet with the Dean of their college at least monthly.
 2. The senator shall attend Department Head/Administrative Council, and other college administrative meetings to:
 - a. Discuss academic issues, student concerns, and keep abreast of college administration/faculty issues.
 - b. Report on college council progress
 3. Participate in and/or assist in the organization of a College of Science student alumni activity as needed.
- II College of Science Senator shall organize and chair the Science Council. Ideally, the Science Council should consist of representation from college clubs and especially from each department. Although the work and activities of the Science Council are ultimately determined by the current Science Senator, the purpose and duties of the Science Council may be defined by the following:

- A. They shall conduct weekly meetings
 - B. They shall work to improve student life within the college and university as a whole.
 - C. They shall keep a log detailing what they did throughout the year. This log is meant to facilitate continuity of ideas and progress from year to year. It may contain such things as legislation apposite to the college, good ideas, programs, and helpful information, etc.
 - D. They may, but are not required to hold, Science Day/Week
- III. The College of Science Senator shall provide training for and facilitate a smooth transition for the newly elected senator.
- A. The Senator shall actively participate in the new senator retreat/workshop at the end of spring semester.
 - B. The Senator shall actively participate in the College Council Member Orientation/Workshop.
