

# Secondary Education/Special Education Mild/Moderate Disabilities Emphasis Plan

This is a model of the requirements and possible sequence of courses for students enrolled in the Dual Major: Secondary Education Content Major and Special Education Major, Mild/Moderate Disabilities Emphasis through the Department of Special Education and Rehabilitation. However, students may progress through the program or have more flexibility if they have high ACT scores, CLEP credit, concurrent enrollment credit, AP credit, and/or transfer credit; or if they attend during summer semesters.

Students should consult with their advisor to develop a plan of study tailored to their individual circumstances.
