

College of Agriculture Scholarships

Undergraduate Scholarships and Awards

The following scholarships and awards are available to undergraduate students *only*. Applications are available at the Dean's Office in the College of Agriculture, Agricultural Science 209.

Agricultural Business and Economics Fund. Awarded annually to students majoring in agricultural economics or agribusiness, based on scholastic achievement, financial need, and performance.

Agricultural Machinery Technology Scholarships. Three or more scholarships awarded to students enrolled in the agricultural machinery technology component of the Agricultural Systems Technology and Education Department. Awards based on financial need and industry restrictions related to career goal.

Alumni Association Scholarships. College of Agriculture Alumni Association makes scholarship awards to students demonstrating academic achievement, personal integrity, outstanding leadership potential, and financial need.

Agricultural Technology Memorial Endowment Fund. Awarded to students who demonstrate the characteristics and values that best represent and honor the lives of the victims and survivors of the September 26, 2005 van accident. The dean of the College of Agriculture shall determine the use of these funds and to whom awards shall be made.

Rodney Chase and Hilda Allred Memorial Scholarship. Awarded to one or more upper-division undergraduate students who are studying agronomy. A one-half tuition scholarship will be awarded for two semesters.

Flora Howard Bardwell Scholarship. Awarded to students majoring in nutrition and food sciences. Eligible candidates shall demonstrate academic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

Dale P. Bateman Dairy Scholarship. Awarded to any student enrolled in the animal and dairy science emphasis, with preference given to applicants seeking a four-year degree in a dairy production field, who have been previously enrolled in the USU Dairy Herdsman Program. May be awarded in full to one student or divided among several students at the dean's discretion. Eligible candidates shall show a keen interest in, and aptitude toward, the dairy industry, meet minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship, and demonstrate that, due to financial need, they would not otherwise be able to complete their degree.

Drs. William H. and James A. Bennett Scholarship. Scholarships awarded to students demonstrating financial need, personal integrity, and scholastic performance. Preference shall be given to applicants who show keen potential in the disciplines of plant or animal science.

Fred A. and Ruth L. Bingham Scholarship. An annual renewable scholarship awarded to an undergraduate student majoring in some field of agriculture. The award is based on high academic standards, superior potential, personal integrity, and a high sense of social and moral responsibility. A recipient may receive the Bingham scholarship for up to four years, if so merited by his or her records of achievement.

Wayne and Lucille S. Binns Scholarship. Awarded to a junior majoring in animal, dairy and veterinary sciences who demonstrates academic achievement, personal integrity, and a high sense of social and moral responsibility.

Lamont G. and Reva A. Blackhurst Endowment Fund in Animal, Dairy and Veterinary Sciences. Awarded to students enrolled in the animal and dairy science emphasis. Eligible candidates shall meet minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship, exhibit superior potential, and demonstrate a record of community service and involvement in extracurricular activities.

Lamont G. and Reva A. Blackhurst Rodeo Club Scholarship. Eligible candidates for this scholarship shall meet minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship, exhibit superior potential, and demonstrate a record of community service and involvement in extracurricular activities. Scholarships are open to students in all academic programs, including programs within the College of Agriculture.

George T. and Eva B. Blanch Scholarship. Student recipients must demonstrate academic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

Professor Aaron F. Bracken Scholarship. Awarded to students studying plant or soil science, with preference given to students enrolled in the agronomy emphasis of the crop science major. Eligible candidates shall have an outstanding academic record, and demonstrate citizenship and service to the broad field of agriculture.

J. Grant Broadbent Award. Scholarship awarded to a sophomore, junior, or senior student enrolled in the animal and dairy science emphasis. The award will be made on the basis of his or her potential for making a significant contribution to the range livestock segment of agriculture, demonstrating leadership, and academic achievement.

Clara L. Budge Scholarship. Awarded to students demonstrating quality academic achievement, superior potential, personal integrity, and a high sense of social and moral responsibility.

Annie "Nan" Nibley Bullen Scholarship. Awarded to a student majoring in family and consumer sciences education who demonstrates financial need and personal integrity, as evidenced by two letters of recommendation.

Kathleen Powell Burton and Janice Burton Gardner Scholarship. Awarded to an undergraduate student majoring in nutrition and food sciences, with particular consideration given to financial need and personal achievement.

Keith Bushman Family Scholarship. Awarded annually to students majoring in animal, dairy and veterinary sciences. Eligible candidates shall be graduates of Lehi High School, residing in

Utah County. In the absence of qualified candidates from Lehi High School, any other Utah resident will be eligible, with preference given to Utah County residents.

George B. Caine Dairy Scholarship Fund. One or more renewable full-tuition scholarships for one semester shall be awarded to deserving full-time students enrolled in the animal and dairy science emphasis.

Evan B. Campbell Scholarship. Awarded to United States citizens who have a major within the College of Agriculture.

Campbell Scientific, Inc. Scholarship. Awarded to United States citizens who have a major within the College of Agriculture.

CHS Foundation Agribusiness Scholarships. Three awards of \$750 each for junior or senior students in agriculture who have had academic instruction in farm cooperatives, based on scholastic achievement and leadership qualities, rather than on financial need. Awarded to students from the following states: Colorado, Idaho, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Montana, Nebraska, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, Wisconsin, and Wyoming. If awarded to juniors, an additional \$750 scholarship will be available for their senior year, subsequent academic year only, providing they still meet the scholarship criteria.

D. Kenneth Christensen Scholarship. Student recipients of the Christensen scholarship shall be majoring in agronomy, and must demonstrate academic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

Alfred E. Clarke Scholarship. Awarded annually to eligible candidates demonstrating academic achievement and financial need.

Leona Bunderson Clement and Erwin "Scotty" Clement Scholarship. Awarded to students majoring in family and consumer sciences education, with an emphasis in clothing construction. Eligible candidates shall meet minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship and be of good moral character. Preference will be given to female students.

John H. Cook and Lila Ann Wheatley Cook Preveterinary Scholarship. Eligible candidates shall be academically worthy preveterinary students pursuing a course of study in bioveterinary science or other related degree programs intended to prepare them for careers as veterinarians.

Susie Sanford Cook Scholarship. A scholarship presented to junior or senior women majoring in nutrition and food sciences who show academic achievement and financial need.

Cooperative Management Fund. Supports students involved in the study and research of consumer and producer cooperatives, as well as management of other types of employee-owned and employee-managed businesses.

Rex F. Daly Scholarship. To be eligible for the Daly Scholarship, students must be majoring in agricultural economics, must demonstrate financial need, and must meet minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship.

Dean's Leadership Award. Full-year in-state tuition waiver awarded to incoming freshmen enrolled full time in a major within the College of Agriculture. Eligible candidates shall have held the office of Utah FFA President, meet minimum University

academic standards to qualify for a scholarship, and have no other tuition waiver for the semesters this award is to be used.

Department of Plants, Soils, and Biometeorology Scholarship. Awarded to outstanding undergraduate students having a major within the department. Selection is based on academic performance and potential for future contributions in agriculture. Special consideration will be given to incoming freshmen and transfer students.

Wade G. Dewey/Utah-Idaho Grain Exchange Scholarship Award. One or more scholarships will be provided to outstanding junior or senior students from the Plants, Soils, and Biometeorology Department who have a special interest in agronomy and plant breeding. Selection is based on academic performance and potential for professional achievement.

C. Anthon and Maurine L. Ernstrom Food Science Scholarship. A renewable full-tuition scholarship awarded annually to juniors or seniors majoring in food science. Preference shall be given to students who exhibit keen skills and potential in dairy food science (irrespective of grade point average), and who have strong moral character.

Family and Consumer Sciences Education Scholarship. Awarded to students majoring in the family and consumer sciences education program who demonstrate academic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

Barnard and Susan Alvord Farr Scholarship. Recipients shall be juniors or seniors who have a major within the College of Agriculture, meet minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship, and demonstrate financial need.

Coy Fife Scholarship. Awarded to eligible students majoring in nutrition and food sciences and demonstrating financial need and personal integrity.

First Security Foundation Scholarship. Scholarship(s) awarded to a student(s) in agriculture during his or her junior or senior year based on merit and need.

Carl O. and Genial Lund Frischknecht Scholarship. Eligible candidates shall demonstrate academic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

D. Dennis and Rebecca Funk Scholarship. Awarded to upper-division undergraduate students in the College of Agriculture. Eligible recipient(s) shall be Utah residents who have a GPA of 3.5 or higher and show economic need.

Boyd and Jean Gardner and J. Rex Gardner Scholarship. Eligible candidates shall be upper-division undergraduate students enrolled in the animal and dairy science emphasis, who meet minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship and demonstrate financial need.

William R. Godfrey Scholarship. Eligible candidates shall be junior or senior students majoring in animal, dairy and veterinary sciences and having a GPA of at least 3.2. Recipients shall have demonstrated both the necessity and willingness to be employed while pursuing their degree. Preference shall be given to qualified descendants of William Godfrey.

Edwin Gossner, Jr. Family Scholarship. Awarded to juniors or seniors pursuing a degree in either dairy production or dairy processing in the College of Agriculture. Eligible candidates shall

meet minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship; however, GPA shall not be the major criteria for selection.

C. T. and JoAnn K. Griffiths Scholarship. Awarded to an upper-division undergraduate student majoring in animal, dairy and veterinary sciences, based upon financial need and academic achievement.

Dr. Mark C. and Jo Ann W. Healey Scholarship in Animal, Dairy and Veterinary Sciences. Awarded to undergraduate students majoring in animal, dairy and veterinary sciences. Eligible candidates shall demonstrate exceptional academic achievement, superior professional potential, and personal integrity. Eligible freshmen students shall have an admissions index score of at least 131 to be considered for this award, and shall provide at least one letter of recommendation from a high school counselor or science teacher addressing the student's potential for academic success in his or her chosen major.

Heber Valley Livestock Foundation Scholarship. Scholarship awarded to a graduating high school senior of Wasatch High School, located in Heber, Utah, or to the child or grandchild of a graduate of Wasatch High School. Eligible candidates must major in some field of study related to range livestock, and may receive the award for up to two years, if their record so merits, and if there are no other qualified applicants.

David and Pamela Hole Scholarship. Eligible candidates shall have completed at least 45 semester credits at Utah State University, be majoring in a crop science discipline, and meet minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship. Priority shall be given to students who have completed most of their degree requirements at Utah State University, and who are excellent students, dedicated to the improvement of agriculture.

Maurine Robson Humphris Scholarship. A scholarship awarded to a junior or senior student majoring in family and consumer sciences education with a record of academic excellence.

Albert Sinclair and Mildred Bowers Hunter Scholarship. Awarded to an upper-division undergraduate student demonstrating financial need and meeting minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship. Preference will be shown to students having majors within the Department of Nutrition and Food Sciences or the Department of Plants, Soils, and Biometeorology.

Dan and Loyal Hunter Scholarship. Awarded to students majoring in agricultural economics or agribusiness based on academic achievement, professional promise, personal integrity, and a high sense of moral responsibility.

Idaho AgCredit Scholarships. Three \$1,000 awards are made annually to full-time students who are enrolled, and have declared an agricultural-related major in the College of Agriculture. Priority is to be given to incoming freshmen. Scholarships awarded will be given to students from the following Idaho counties: Bannock, Bear Lake, Blaine, Bingham, Bonneville, Butte, Camas, Caribou, Cassia, Clark, Custer, Franklin, Fremont, Gooding, Jefferson, Jerome, Lemhi, Lincoln, Madison, Minidoka, Oneida, Power, Teton, and Twin Falls; and the Teton and Lincoln counties in Wyoming. Awards shall be made on the basis of academic achievement and financial need.

Institute for Antiviral Research Bioveterinary Science Scholarship Quasi-Endowment Fund. Awarded annually to an incoming freshman student who demonstrates academic achievement, financial need, and an interest in bioveterinary science research. Eligible candidates must submit a letter of recommendation from their high school science instructor, outlining their scientific interests while in high school.

Institute of Food Technologists Scholarships. Scholarships of \$500-1,000 are available on a nationally competitive basis for students in accredited food sciences and food technology programs. Applications for this scholarship may be obtained from the Department of Nutrition and Food Sciences.

Frank H. and Pearl L. Jackson Agricultural Endowment Scholarships. One or more scholarships awarded annually to assist future generations of students in the College of Agriculture. Eligible candidates shall demonstrate financial need, personal integrity, quality academic achievement or potential, and a strong sense of performance commitment.

Katie Karikka Scholarship. Scholarship awarded to a high school student, completing his or her senior year in high school, who will major in family and consumer sciences education during the following academic year. Awards are to be made based on academic achievement and financial need.

Dr. Leonard C. and Dorothy C. Kearl Scholarship. Scholarships awarded to students dedicated to completing their degrees in animal, dairy and veterinary sciences and meeting minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship.

R. Paul and Lorna Larsen Scholarship. Awarded to one or more horticulture students from the State of Utah, or the immediate surrounding area, at the discretion of the department head of the Plants, Soils, and Biometeorology Department.

Glenn E. Leggett Memorial Scholarship. One or more scholarships with a combined value of \$350-450 awarded to upper-division undergraduate students having an emphasis in soil fertility and/or plant nutrition. Eligible candidates shall demonstrate scholastic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

Dr. H. Alan Luke Scholarship. One or more annual, renewable scholarships awarded to upper-division students majoring in agricultural economics, with a minor in one of the other departments within the College of Agriculture. Eligible candidates must have an agricultural background; must have graduated from a rural high school in the State of Utah; and must demonstrate academic achievement, leadership, and financial need, in that order of importance. Applicants must also submit a 400- to 500-word essay on a topic selected by Dr. Luke. Contact the department head for the required topic and submit the completed essay with the scholarship application. This scholarship may be awarded a second time to a student who continues to excel in meeting the standards on which it is granted, and who has made satisfactory progress toward graduation.

Eliza B. Mackay Scholarship in Family and Consumer Sciences Education. Awarded to students majoring in family and consumer sciences education demonstrating academic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

Hyrum J. Mackay Award. Recipients of this award should demonstrate academic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

Milton A. Madsen Memorial Scholarship Fund. Awarded to full-time students enrolled in the animal and dairy science emphasis who are studying sheep or beef cattle production. Eligible candidates shall be sophomore, junior, or senior students who demonstrate financial need, scholarship, leadership, and interest in animal science as a profession or vocation.

Arthur W. Mahoney Scholarship. A memorial scholarship awarded to a senior student majoring in nutrition who is planning to attend graduate school. Eligible candidates shall demonstrate academic achievement and financial need.

Arola B. McDonald Dietetics Scholarship Endowment. A renewable, annual award available to an undergraduate student majoring in nutrition and food sciences with an emphasis in dietetics. The award is based on financial need, scholastic achievement, potential, and moral and personal integrity.

Marriner Wood Merrill Endowment. Awarded annually to a student demonstrating quality academic achievement, superior potential, personal integrity, and a high sense of social and moral responsibility.

Skyler Mark Miller Memorial Scholarship. Awarded to students who show great promise in their chosen field and because of financial need, may not otherwise be able to obtain a higher education.

Johanna Moen Scholarship. Awarded annually to students majoring in family and consumer sciences education. Eligibility based on financial need and general aptitude.

Ronald L. Moshier Scholarship. Awarded to a student having a major within the Department of Plants, Soils, and Biometeorology and meeting minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship.

Harvard G. and J. Wesley Nelson Scholarship. Awarded to students majoring in nutrition and food sciences. Eligible candidates must have a good work ethic, common sense, and professional potential, and must meet minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship.

Reece D. and Bonnie F. Nielsen Scholarship. Awarded annually to eligible students in the College of Agriculture. Eligible candidates must demonstrate financial need, personal integrity, and scholastic potential as attested to by three letters of recommendation from reputable sources. Preference shall be given to the direct descendants of Reece D. and Bonnie Fife Nielsen who meet these criteria, regardless of major, until the year 2024, after which date the preferential criteria discontinues.

Robert D. and Lenore L. Nielson Scholarship. Renewable, annual scholarship awarded to upper-division undergraduate students majoring in environmental, soil, and water sciences. Preference will be given to students who have financial need, exhibit keen skills and potential (irrespective of grade point average), and have a strong desire to promote the wisest and best use of the earth's natural soil, water, and plant resources.

Major A. and Lucy Nilson Scholarship. Scholarship recipients shall have agricultural backgrounds and be enrolled in the

preveterinary program in the Department of Animal, Dairy and Veterinary Sciences in the College of Agriculture.

Dr. Don B. and Joyce Olsen Scholarship. Scholarships will be awarded to rural, undergraduate students residing in all Utah counties, excluding Salt Lake County, and pursuing any degree program within the College of Agriculture. Eligible candidates shall demonstrate financial need, personal integrity, and scholastic potential.

John E. and Ruth M. Osguthorpe Scholarship in Plants, Soils, and Biometeorology. Awarded to students majoring in the following agricultural production courses in order of priority: (1) agronomy; (2) soil science; (3) production horticulture; and (4) any other major in the Department of Plants, Soils, and Biometeorology. Eligible candidates shall demonstrate academic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

John E. and Ruth M. Osguthorpe Scholarship in Agriculture. Awarded to students majoring in the following agricultural production courses: agronomy, soil science (particularly soil fertility), animal science (excluding bioveterinary science), agricultural education, and agricultural mechanics. Eligible candidates should demonstrate financial need as a first priority and must meet minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship.

Lane M. and Anne R. Palmer Scholarship. Candidates shall demonstrate financial need and must meet minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship.

W. Horace Palmer Scholarship. Awarded first to graduates of Milford High School, and secondly to Utah high school graduates from Beaver, Iron, or Millard counties. Eligible candidates must be enrolled at Utah State University, be majoring in the College of Agriculture, meet minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship, and demonstrate financial need. Preference will be given to (1) a student enrolled in dairy production, and (2) a student in any other livestock program in the College of Agriculture.

Leneve O. and Darold E. Petersen Scholarship. Awarded to students enrolled in the animal, dairy and veterinary sciences major who are committed to practicing veterinary science as a career.

Lorin D. Pollard Memorial Scholarship. Awarded to a student demonstrating quality academic achievement, superior potential, personal integrity, and a high sense of social and moral responsibility. Preference shall be given to an LDS returned missionary.

H. Paul and Mary Jane Rasmussen Scholarship in Urban Horticulture. Award of \$1,000 given to a student beginning his or her sophomore year who demonstrates financial need and meets minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship. Eligible candidates shall have an interest in working with a botanical center or an arboretum, demonstrated by submission of a one-page statement of their reasons for considering a career associated with one of these areas.

Charles Redd Foundation Scholarships. Awarded to agricultural undergraduate students based on need, academic achievement, personal integrity, and a high sense of social and moral responsibility. Primary use of this fund will be to fill an emergency need. Therefore, the Associate Dean for Academic Pro-

grams in the College of Agriculture will award the annual scholarship(s) as emergency needs occur throughout the academic year.

Dr. and Mrs. Eldrow “Dutch” Reeve Scholarship. Awarded to students majoring in nutrition and food sciences who demonstrate superior potential, quality academic achievement, personal integrity, and a high sense of social and moral responsibility.

Rolla M. Rich Memorial Fund. A scholarship awarded to a junior or senior student who is a member of the Agricultural Student Council. Eligible candidates shall demonstrate exceptional character, scholarship, and leadership in agriculture.

Stanley S. Richardson Scholarship in Agricultural Systems Technology and Education. Awarded to students majoring in agricultural education who demonstrate financial need, personal integrity, and good citizen and community service. Particular attention should be given to applicants who show keen potential and excellent teaching abilities in a classroom setting.

Ritewood Inc. Scholarship. Awarded annually to a nutrition student and a food science student.

Seely-Hinckley Scholarship. Full tuition and fees to be awarded for one year at the in-state rate for students demonstrating financial need and superior achievement. May be renewable if merited by special financial need and academic achievement.

James LeGrande and Faye C. Shupe Scholarship. At least five scholarships awarded as follows: (1) one to three awards shall be made to incoming freshmen students enrolled in the bioveterinary science emphasis of high academic merit; (2) two or more recipients shall be academically worthy sophomore to senior students enrolled in the bioveterinary science emphasis or students enrolled in other related degree programs intended to prepare them for careers as veterinarians; and (3) two or more awards shall be made to students majoring in fields related to animal health, based on financial need.

Donald L. Staheli Scholarship. Recipients must have a minimum GPA of 3.3 and demonstrate financial need.

Nedra Wright Stevens Memorial and Major General Lynn H. Stevens Scholarship. Awarded to junior or senior students majoring in family and consumer sciences education.

Helen Thackery Stevenson Scholarship. Awarded to students majoring in nutrition and food sciences who demonstrate academic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

Delbert and Joycelyn Tarbet Scholarship. An annual scholarship of \$1,000 awarded to a student who meets minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship and who (1) due to financial need would not otherwise be able to complete his or her degree, and (2) has a true desire to gain his or her degree, showing a particular ambition to contribute, throughout his or her career, to the agricultural industry.

Frances G. Taylor Phi Upsilon Omicron Scholarship. Awarded to a U.S. citizen who is an active member of Kappa Chapter, Phi Upsilon Omicron. Recipient must be majoring in nutrition and food sciences, and must demonstrate high academic achievement, professional and personal leadership, and personal integrity.

Sterling A. Taylor Memorial Scholarship. One or more scholarships with a combined value of \$900-1,000 awarded to outstanding sophomore, junior, or senior students in the Department of Plants, Soils, and Biometeorology, with special consideration given to students studying soil, plants, or climate. Selection is based on high scholastic standing, leadership qualities, character, and potential in the students' fields of study.

Utah Agricultural Leadership Scholarship. A renewable scholarship awarded annually. Recipients must have been residents of Utah for at least three years and must be majoring in fields associated with production agriculture. Preference shall be given to students who exhibit keen skills and potential and a strong orientation toward good citizenship and community service.

Utah Association of Agriculture Educators Scholarship. A \$500 scholarship awarded to senior students preparing to complete student teaching and licensure requirements. Award based on superior achievement and need.

Utah Association of Conservation Districts Auxiliary Scholarship. Awarded to upper-division undergraduate students enrolled full time at Utah State University, and who have graduated from a Utah high school. Eligible candidates must demonstrate academic achievement, with a GPA of 3.5 or higher, and show financial need.

Utah Dairy Commission Scholarships. One or more scholarships awarded annually to outstanding junior or senior students majoring in a dairy curriculum or a closely related agricultural major dealing with production, processing, product development, or marketing.

Utah Farm Bureau Federation Scholarships. Three awards of \$1,000 each. **President's Award:** Awarded to an undergraduate student in agricultural production. **Leadership Award:** Awarded to the student who has exhibited the greatest measure of growth and excellence in scholarship, constructive organization, and leadership in the College of Agriculture through University courses. **Utah Farm Bureau Scholar:** Awarded to senior students completing requirements for teacher licensure in agriculture. Selection based on scholarship, leadership, and financial need.

Utah Nursery and Landscape Association/Wayne Hansen Memorial Scholarship Fund. Annual renewable scholarship awarded to Utah residents. Eligible candidates must be juniors or seniors majoring in horticulture who have maintained good scholastic standing, exhibit financial need, and are sincere about pursuing a career in the nursery, landscape, greenhouse, or related “green” industries.

Harris O. and Eleanor Y. Van Orden Endowed Scholarship. Awarded annually to an undergraduate student having a high academic record, who is majoring in nutrition and food sciences.

H. Grant and Gayle P. Vest Scholarship. Annual renewable award given to students demonstrating financial need, a commitment to agriculture, good scholastic performance, and a strong interest and potential to succeed in their major. Preference shall be given to: (1) horticulture majors, (2) crop science majors, and (3) soil science majors.

Angelyn W. and Bryce N. Wadley Scholarship. Awarded annually to junior or senior students in the Department of Plants,

Soils, and Biometeorology. Preference shall be given to a student studying plant science who meets minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship.

Nancy Burton Wagstaff Scholarship. Awarded to an undergraduate student in the Department of Nutrition and Food Sciences with consideration given to financial need and academic achievement.

Western AgCredit Scholarship. Five \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to undergraduate students enrolled in an agricultural production or agribusiness major in the College of Agriculture. Three scholarships will be awarded based upon financial need, and two will be awarded based upon academic achievement. Preference for academic standing will be based upon the greatest recruiting need within the College of Agriculture.

Reva Lewis White Scholarship. Awarded to students majoring in family and consumer sciences education who demonstrate academic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

Woodward-Ritewood Endowment. Awarded annually to students majoring in nutrition and food sciences, based on academic

achievement, superior potential, personal integrity, and a high sense of social and moral responsibility.

Robert L. Wrigley Scholarship. Awarded to a student enrolled in the animal and dairy science emphasis, based on academic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

Dale W. and Adele Christensen Young Scholarship in Agricultural Systems Technology and Education. Awarded to students in the Department of Agricultural Systems Technology and Education who demonstrate superior potential, quality academic achievement, personal integrity, and a high sense of social responsibility. Preference shall be given to students intending to pursue a career in the agricultural chemical industry or associated agricultural systems technologies, such as conservation tillage systems and sustainable agriculture.

Dale W. and Adele Christensen Young Scholarship in Plants, Soils, and Biometeorology. Awarded to students in the Department of Plants, Soils, and Biometeorology who demonstrate superior potential, quality academic achievement, personal integrity, and a high sense of social responsibility. Preference shall be given to students intending to pursue a career in the agricultural chemical industry or associated agricultural systems technologies, such as conservation tillage systems and sustainable agriculture.

Graduate Scholarships and Awards

The following scholarships and awards are available to graduate students *only*. Applications are available at the Dean's Office in the College of Agriculture, Agricultural Science 209.

Cache Valley Cooperative Scholarship. Awarded to graduate students majoring in dairy science, agricultural economics, or sociology. Recipients are expected to write a master's thesis dealing with cooperatives. Thesis must be acceptable to supervising department.

William C. Claypool Scholarship. Awarded to a graduate student whose research and thesis are directed toward the study of some problem significant to Cache Valley agriculture.

Noelle and John Cockett Graduate Fellowship in the College of Agriculture. Awarded to graduate students in the College of Agriculture.

Ralph Garr Cutler Scholarship. One or more scholarships awarded to graduate students studying agricultural economics or agribusiness. Awards based on academic achievement and professional promise.

Maurine Flint Keller Memorial Scholarship. Award given annually to a graduate student, based on scholastic merit and potential to contribute to the field of family and consumer sciences education.

Robert N. Love Scholarship. Expendable fund to support returning graduate students (i.e., students with four or more years since last enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate degree program). Eligible candidates shall demonstrate scholastic achievement and/or potential.

Frank O. and Ina Seely Morgan Scholarship. Awarded to graduate students in the Department of Plants, Soils, and Biometeorology conducting their post-graduate work in the field of plant genetics and breeding. Emphasis shall be placed on potential and academic merit.

John Seymour Memorial Scholarship. Candidates will be recommended through the Bolivian Alumni Association, and will be subject to the prevailing requirements and standards for admission to the School of Graduate Studies at USU. The funding commitments will continue for at least two years for an MS student and three years for a PhD student.

Dr. Arvil L. and Elva Acklam Stark Scholarship. Awarded annually to a graduate horticulture student with proposed research in fruit or vegetable culture, organic agriculture, or landscape improvement. Preference will be given to students planning a career with the University Extension Service in horticulture. Selection will be based on financial need, academic achievement and initiative, superior potential, and personal integrity.

John Shaw Welch Scholarship. An annual award to a graduate student doing research work reflecting the agronomic publications of John Shaw Welch, relating to plant-source food for human consumption, or developing environmentally appropriate pest control. The candidate must demonstrate academic achievement, personal integrity, and financial need.

Undergraduate and Graduate Scholarships and Awards

The following scholarships and awards are available to *both* undergraduate and graduate students. Applications are available at the Dean's Office in the College of Agriculture, Agricultural Science 209.

Allen N. and Helen Adams Scholarship. Three scholarships awarded to upper-division undergraduate or graduate students as follows: the Doyle J. Matthews Award in Animal Physiology and Breeding; the Norris J. Stenquist Award in Animal Management and Extension; and the John E. Butcher Award in Animal Nutrition. Eligible candidates shall demonstrate academic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

Melvin E. Anderson Scholarship. Awarded to upper-division undergraduate or graduate students who demonstrate academic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity. Preference shall be given to students majoring in horticulture or plant breeding.

Ralph S. and De Ora Anderson Blackham Scholarship. A scholarship awarded to undergraduate or graduate students studying agriculture. Awards are based on scholarship, accomplishments, and financial need.

Richard L. Chase Memorial Scholarship. Awarded to a junior, senior, or graduate student in the Department of Plants, Soils, and Biometeorology. Preference shall be given to students studying weed science. Selection is based on academic achievement and professional potential.

Hung Wo Ching Agricultural Economics Scholarships. Annual, renewable scholarships awarded to undergraduate and graduate students in good standing majoring in agricultural economics. Eligible candidates shall be United States citizens who demonstrate academic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

Davis County Master Gardener Association Scholarship. Awarded to an upper-division undergraduate or graduate student pursuing a degree within the Department of Plants, Soils, and Biometeorology. Preference shall be given to students studying horticulture and students from Davis County. Eligible candidates shall demonstrate academic achievement, financial need, and commitment to service.

Grace Williams Funk and Kaye Funk Scholarship. Awarded to a Utah resident senior or graduate student studying nutrition and food sciences and meeting minimum University academic standards to qualify for a scholarship. Clinical dietetics majors are not eligible.

Dr. Niranjan R. Gandhi and Mrs. Josephine N. Gandhi Scholarship. Awarded to outstanding undergraduate and graduate students majoring in nutrition and food sciences, with a food sci-

ence emphasis or specialization. The awards are based on scholastic achievement, financial need, and personal integrity.

Dr. Ethelyn O. Greaves Memorial Endowment. Annual, renewable awards to sophomore, junior, senior, or graduate students in the family and consumer sciences education program. Eligible candidates shall demonstrate need, self-help, scholastic achievement, potential, and moral and personal integrity. Preference will be given to individuals who would benefit most from the financial assistance.

Anna Lou Rees Hansen Scholarship. A scholarship awarded to outstanding upper-division undergraduate or graduate students, majoring in family and consumer sciences education and demonstrating financial need.

Andrew L. and Corinne G. Heggie Scholarship. Scholarship awarded annually to undergraduate or graduate students demonstrating superior potential in the field of agriculture, personal integrity, and a high sense of social and ethical responsibility. GPA shall not be the main criteria for selection, and eligible candidates must demonstrate a desire to succeed and to make a contribution in the areas of dryland farming or wheat research.

David S. and Retta W. Jennings Scholarship. An annual scholarship awarded to an upper-division undergraduate or graduate student majoring in soil science/agronomy. Eligible candidates shall demonstrate financial need and personal integrity.

Theta Johnson Scholarship. Awarded to an outstanding senior or graduate student whose area of study is family and consumer sciences education. Preference will be given to an individual with 4-H experience.

Mr. and Mrs. William W. Owens Scholarship. Awarded annually to senior or graduate students in dairy science who need financial assistance in order to complete their degrees, and who demonstrate academic achievement and personal integrity.

Dr. Eldrow "Dutch" and Marjorie Seely Reeve Scholarship. A scholarship for undergraduate and graduate students majoring in nutrition and food sciences, and demonstrating financial need, academic achievement, integrity, and potential.

Ethelwyn B. Wilcox Human Nutrition Scholarship Fund. Awarded annually to a sophomore through graduate student majoring in human nutrition who has maintained superior grades for the preceding academic year, and on the basis of demonstrated need relating to educational costs.
