Admission Requirements For This Major

Students with less than 24 semester credits may declare a premajor in FCS (PFCS). Completion of at least 24 semester credits (including FCHD 1010, 1500, 2400, and 2450) with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 is required for admission into the FCS major.

The Program

The Family and Consumer Sciences (FCS) major is an integrative major that links the various fields within the family and consumer sciences profession and prepares students for positions requiring interdisciplinary problem-solving skills.

Background Check. A criminal background check, including fingerprinting, is required for everyone who completes the FCHD 4950 practicum through the Department of Family, Consumer, and Human Development.

Students in the department are required to complete at least one practicum experience, which is arranged with the practicum coordinator.

Career Opportunities

The Family and Consumer Sciences major prepares graduates for positions in business, local/state/federal agencies, child care centers, youth programs, job training centers, and other related agencies.

Communications Literacy (CL1 and CL2) (6 credits)
ENGL 1010 (CL1) (3 credits) or satisfactory AP, CLEP, IBO,

Quantitative Literacy (QL) (3 credits)

STAT 1040 (3 credits)

Computer and Information Literacy (0 credits)

Passing grade on six computer and information literacy related examinations.

Breadth Requirements (18-20 credits)

Select at least one approved course from each of the following six categories: **American Institutions (BAI)**, **Creative Arts (BCA)**, **Humanities (BHU)**, **Life Sciences (BLS)**, **Physical Sciences (BPS)**, and **Social Sciences (BSS)**. At least two of the six breadth courses must be University Studies courses with a **USU prefix** (excluding USU 1000, 1010, 1100, 1100, and 3330). (CLEP or AP credit may be used.) PHIL 1120 or 2400 will fulfill the Humanities requirement; NFS 1020 will fulfill the Life Sciences requirement; and FCHD 1500, 2400, or 2450 will fulfill the Social Sciences requirement for students in the Family and Consumer Sciences major.

Exploration Requirement (3-4 credits)

Choose an additional class from one of the following General Education categories: QL, BAI, BCA, BHU, BLS, BPS, or BSS.

Depth Education Requirements

Communications Intensive (CI) (2 courses)

Two courses having CI designation (such as OSS 1550, FCHD 4900, SPCH 1020, and SPCH 2110) will meet this requirement.

Quantitative Intensive (QI) (1 course)

One course having QI designation (such as FCHD 3130) will meet this requirement.

Depth Course Requirements (4 credits minimum, including 2 credits minimum completed in each of two courses)

Complete at least 2 credits in approved 3000-level or above courses from each of the following two categories: **Humanities and Creative Arts (DHA)** and **Life and Physical Sciences (DSC)**. NFS 3110 or FCSE 3030 will meet the DSC requirement. FCSE 3080 will meet the DHA requirement.

Departmental Program Requirements

The department has several regulations governing students' academic progress:

1. The *P/D+*, *D*, *F* option cannot be used for courses required in the FCS major.
2. An overall cumulative GPA of 3.0 is required for entrance to the major. An overall GPA of 3.0 is required for graduation. A GPA of 3.0 in FCS major courses is also required for graduation.
3. The completion of all major requirements, as described below, is required.
4. **Ten-year Policy.** Courses which are required for the major will be accepted *only* if they have been completed within the last 10 years.

Prior to enrollment, students must have achieved junior standing, and must have completed a total of at least 30 FCHD credits, a Communications Intensive (CI) course, and an ethics course. Practicum application deadlines are as follows: February 15 for fall semester, June 15 for spring semester, and October 15 for summer semester.

³Students must sign up at least one year in advance in Family Life 205.
