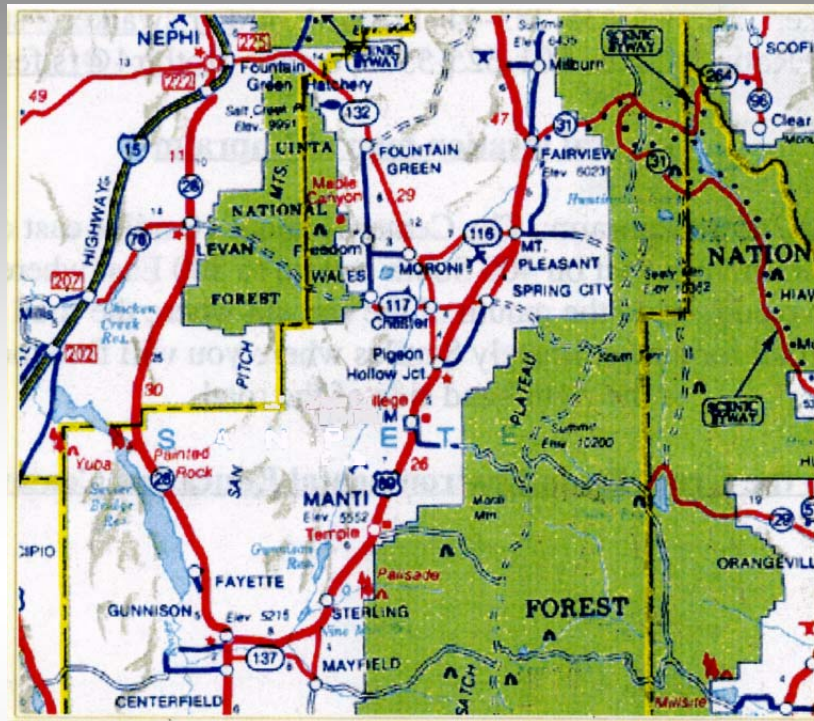

Directions to GBEEC from Ephraim: The Center is about 10 miles east of Ephraim. From Main Street in Ephraim turn east on 400 South and go to 300 East where you take a right turn. Follow the paved road to the mouth of the canyon where the road becomes gravel. Follow the gravel road for approximately 8 miles where you will find the GBEEC sign on the right hand side of the road.
