Zeke and Zach are pictured here at the summit of Table Mountain, just west of the Teton Range in Wyoming. This is just one of about 60 peaks Zach has climbed, and one of about 30 for Zeke. In addition to being climbing stud-puppies, these dogs are well-traveled; they've been as far south as Copper Canyon in Chihuahua, Mexico, and as far north as Inuvik in the Northwest Territories of Canada.
