

At the Fair

Students entered in the EXHIBIT category:

1. Place project on a table in the main area of the fair.
2. Remember the table number (their will be one or two projects per number on each table).
3. Go to the registration table. Report your name or group leader and table number to the History Fair staff.
4. Wait to be judged. Students will only be judged face-to-face once.
5. Be prepared to answer the judge or judges' questions concerning the project. Students *may not* prepare a statement and give a presentation to the judges.
6. Students may leave their exhibit after they have been judged. Student may take valuable items with them at this time; the History Fair staff is not responsible for missing items.
7. A final round of judging will take place without the students present.

Students entered in the DOCUMENTARY and PERFORMANCE categories:

1. Be present for a pre-assigned judging time. The times will be posted near the registration desk on the day of the fair and possibly online prior to the fair. Documentary and Performance participants *do not* need to report to the registration desk
2. The Utah History Fair recommends that students be near their room *15 minutes* prior to the judging time. Please wait quietly so that you do not interfere with any judging taking place.
3. With a few exceptions noted prior to the respective regional fair, students will only be judged once in the performance and documentary categories.
4. The History Fair provides DVDs and TVs for those participating in the Documentary category. Students may want to bring a laptop as back-up.

HISTORICAL PAPERS and WEB SITES:

Results for the Historical Paper and Web site categories will be announced online by March 5 and during the awards ceremony at the regional fair. Students participating in these categories will not be judged face-to-face. These participants are not required by the Utah History Fair to be present, though they are subject to their school codes.
