Summer Activity Guide 2025

Sixty-four percent of children under the age of 18 in Utah have both parents in the workforce. This presents the potential for many of our children to be left at home without adult supervision or a set schedule during the summer months, particularly for our school aged kids. While some older children may show responsibility and maturity, leaving younger children alone for extended periods during the summer can pose risks to their safety, well-being, and emotional health. Ideally, adult supervision or organized activities are recommended for children under 12 during the summer.

Summertime activities are a wonderful opportunity for kids while they are out of school. Children who are engaged in summertime activities gain increased physical health, social development, emotional well-being, and general life skills. Care About Childcare recognizes the importance of children being involved in summertime activities. We hope you take the time to look through these activities and pick out those that are best suited to your child's interests and your needs.

What kind of training, education, and experience do the caregivers have? Caregivers who have special training or degrees in working with children might be more skilled in helping your child learn. How long have the caregivers been working at this program? It's good to know their experience level. ✨
