

USU Community-Engaged Learning Course Contract

A Community-Engaged Learning (CEL) contract is an agreement between a Christensen Community Scholar and an instructor to take an UPPER-DIVISION course for Community-Engaged Learning (CEL) credit. The instructor determines what activity can be counted toward CEL credit. The work is not generally graded and does not impact the student's grade in the class.

Students: Download the contract before the end of the second week of class. Ask your instructor if they would be willing to work with you on an additional project that applies course content to a community-identified need. If so, complete the form and return the signed contract to the Assistant Director of Community-Engaged Learning.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Contracts are for use by Christensen Community Scholars only
- The contract must be for an upper-division class that is part of the student's plan of study
- Contracts may not be used retroactively for classes taken previously
- "Incompletes" are not permitted. The student must finish the work in CEL work during the semester contracted.

The Community-Engaged project or research:

The work needs to meet a community-identified need, integrating learning, action, and reflection (usually a reflective paper relating the activity to the content covered in the course). The work should provide intellectual enrichment that goes beyond regular course material. The student and the instructor will meet outside of class to discuss the project. The community partner is to be involved in all aspects of project development.
