We require a minimum of 100 youth. Our minimum sample size is required for two reasons. First, this is ultimately a feasibility study for recruiting Latino youth across the Wasatch Front in Utah, and we require a minimum of 100 youth to demonstrate for future funding applications that we are able to effectively recruit youth across a relatively broad geographic range, at 25 youth per target county.

Second, our research questions rely on understanding within-group variation, and will use analytic techniques such as regression, and structural equation modeling, which means that we need a minimum of 100 participants for power considerations. This number will give us an initial indication of effect sizes that we will use to guide future power analyses that might suggest either larger or smaller sample sizes. Thus, in this current pilot work we are not seeking to draw generalizable conclusions, but to lay the groundwork for a study that would be able to provide data necessary to draw more generalizable conclusions.

Because this is a pilot study and it is important to gather data from this demographically important population, we also request to recruit up to a maximum of 150 youth (if recruitment is going well), in order to increase the precision of our estimates in the data analysis phase and to show greater feasibility of recruitment.
