TRADITION

DID YOU KNOW: In 1901, the USU faculty adopted royal blue and white as the college colors. The name Aggie had a more informal beginning with the first athletic team called "The Farmers." Aggies, a contraction of agriculturalists, was first used in the late 1890s, though as early as 1916 the local paper called the various athletic teams "Big Blue" — an apparent reference to the Blue Ox of Paul Bunyan stories.

DID YOU KNOW: In 1909, the first senior class gift was an "A" placed on the west side of Old Main Tower. The "A," now on all four sides of the tower, can be seen throughout the valley, especially at night when it shines white. For special occasions and athletic wins the "A" shines blue.
