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





## What is Social Justice?



- Recognition of social inequities.
- Actions that strive to foster equality by addressing the perceived barriers that hinder access, *meaningful* engagement, *valued* contribution, and *reciprocal* outcome.

# "A Theory of Justice" (John Rawls, 1972, 1999)

- Justice equates fairness:
  - Right to equal access towards basic liberties in a similar vein as others.
  - Right to fair treatment in manner that is reasonably expected.
- Based on a liberalism.
  - Rationale behavior is determined by what is perceived as beneficial for society operating under the premise that each individual has a fair share.
- Presented as an idealistic "goal."
  - **Equal distribution** of social values (i.e., liberty, opportunity, income, wealth, self-respect).

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








# Perception, Perspective, Positioning

- DICTATE how other people perceive, respond to, and engage with us









The practicing of justice (recognition and action) are driven by individual and societal philosophical ideologies of reality, knowledge, and ethics (morality)...where the underlying conceptions of normality are rooted in a culture of whiteness...

### Whiteness as a Cultural Phenomenon


- Whiteness as Property (Cheryl Harris, 1993)
  - Right of disposition: Transference (not) of whiteness  $\rightarrow$  assimilation & accommodation.

  - Reputation and status property: Regality of being white  $\rightarrow$  white = clean, pure, whole, prestigious.
  - Absolute right to exclude: Defining whiteness by determining what is "not white"
- Phenomenology of Whiteness (Sara Ahmed, 2007)
  - Shapes and informs perceptions, standpoint/position, understandings and experiences of reality and life.
  - Outcome of social stratification processes that in turn determine social mobility, socialpsychological-physical safety.
- Emotionality of Whiteness (Cheryl Matias, 2016)
  - Constant centering of whiteness through emotions that facilitate the stalling or quashing of racerelated conversations and work.
- Hegemonic Whiteness (Nolan Cabrera, 2018)
  - Maintenance and reinforcement of white racial dominance through de facto social stratification.

# Whiteness and Western Colonialism

• Physical and cultural imperialism as the forced establishment of a new dominant ideology, perspective, and notion of normality.


• Epistemic injustice and the dejection of Indigenous and Afrocentric ways of knowing, doing, and being.




# Whiteness in/through Liberalism & Social Justice

- Conflating the Dismantling of Structural Oppression with DEI
  - Social Mobility = Individual Effort → Pathologizing of Social Conditions.
  - The Rationale Behavior of White Guilt >> Fetishizing or Ignoring of Black Trauma.
  - The Individual as the Unit of Measure → Tokenism & Martyrdom.

- Continued Centering and Re-Centering of White Interests
  - Working towards Equality → Lack of Divestment in Power Across All Dimensions.
  - Acknowledgement of Social Injustice  $\rightarrow$  White Gaze in Naming Problem, Solution, & Benefactors.
  - The Individual as the Unit of Measure → Hierarchy of Enacted Activism (Least to Most Involved with Individual Divestment in Power).

# Because your liberation is bound up with mine...

- Check Your "Self" Biases, Privileges, Position, Power, Commitments, and Actions
  - What is your motivation for doing this work?
  - Who is truly benefitting from your actions and in what ways?
  - Are you divesting from power in ways that can detrimentally impact your standard of living?
  - Whose voice, needs, desires, goals, and feelings are <u>driving</u> the work and <u>determining</u> the outcomes?
- Consider your Role, its Power and Privilege:
  - Perpetrator Leveraging privilege and power to **explicitly contribute** to oppression
  - Bystander
  - Ally
  - Advocate
  - Co-Conspirator
  - Conspirator Leveraging privilege and power to **explicitly combat** oppression specific to your identity group.




